Dr. Dave Chatterjee is tenured Associate Professor, in the MIS department, at the Terry College of Business, The University of Georgia (UGA). An accomplished scholar and technology thought leader, Dr. Chatterjee’s interest and expertise lie in the various facets of technology management – from technology sense-making to implementation and change management, data governance, internal controls, information security, and performance measurement.
